

FROM THE CO's DESK

Our shifting Strategic Paradigm.

The release of the Defence Strategic Review in April 2023 acknowledged the changed strategic circumstances that Australia faces in the Indo-Pacific region. The likelihood of non-military competition leading to large-scale conventional conflict is now greater than at any time since the Second World War. Regional tensions have risen and the strategic warning time that Australia previously relied upon to prepare for conflict has now been significantly reduced. There is now acknowledgement that to effectively defend Australia the ADF needs the ability to project power beyond our borders, denying any adversary's attempts to project power against Australia through our northern approaches or sea lanes of communication. This concept of National Defence forms part of a whole-of-government strategy to safeguard Australia from major power competition, including the prospect of conflict.

Against this prospect the Australian Army is transforming to meet the requirements of the future integrated force. Army will be optimised for littoral manoeuvre by land, air and sea. Army's future close combat capabilities will now be centred around a single armoured combined-arms brigade. Importantly, the Royal Regiment of Australian Artillery (RAA) will take on the critical tasks of delivering enhanced long-range fires, which will include a land-based maritime strike capability, along with integrated air and missile defence. The focus on long-range fires

and integrated air and missile defence has not however come without the need for some offsets and government has decided to cancel the purchase of a second regiment of protected mobility fires (AS-9 Huntsman self-propelled artillery) to allow for the purchase of additional HIMARS launchers.

To generate Army's contribution to the integrated force the 1st, 3rd and 7th Brigades have all come under command of the 1st (Australian) Division. Forces Command now takes on the role of training across Army to achieve a unified approach to individual and collective training while the 2nd (Australian) Division comprising the 4th, 5th, 11th and 13th Brigades is now responsible for the security of Australia's northern base network and other critical infrastructure.

As I mentioned in my article in 2022, Army has raised a new Fires Formation officially to be designated as the 10th Brigade. The 9th Regiment is planned to leave the 2nd (Australian) Division to move under command of the Fires Formation, on order, sometime in or after January 2024. It will join the 16th Regiment (eNASAAMS) and the soon to be raised 14th Regiment (HIMARS) in this new formation. The 10th Brigade will come under command of the 1st (Australian) Division once it achieves initial operational capability in 2025.

The 9th Regiment continues to accelerate its transition away from the 81mm mortar capability as part of the Artillery Modernisation Plan. Each Battery across the Regiment can now generate a suite of capabilities with an emphasis on the Surveillance and Target Acquisition role. Contemporary capabilities like our Joint Fires Teams can be augmented by Small Uncrewed Aerial Systems (SUAS) and Radars. In time, each Battery is also planned to generate a Fires Troop-worth of gunners capable of integrating with a HIMARS or M777 Battery from one of the full-time Regiments. As the only Reserve unit of the RAA, the 9th Regiment plays a critical role for the RAA as part of the Total Workforce Model being applied across the entire Australian Defence Force, that aims to better leverage the contributions and capability offerings of part-time defence members.

7 Battery

Against the changing strategic circumstances 7 Battery has had a particularly busy year in 2023.

Much of the training year has been spent preparing for and deploying on Exercise TALISMAN SABRE 23. 7 Battery led the 9th Regiment's contribution to Battle Group WARATAH which centred on the 4/3 Battalion, Royal New South Wales Regiment. Commencing with CRAWL and WALK activities, preparation for TALSISMAN SABRE culminated with WARATAH RUN which was conducted at Singleton in March 2023. In addition to providing direct support to the combat team in the field, 7 Battery also conducted an 81mm mortar live fire practice to qualify trainees on the Artillery Forward Observer (AFO) Basic Course during WARATAH RIIN

After successful completion of preparatory activities 7 Battery deployed to Townsville in late July to marryup with Battle Group WARATAH. The Battle Group then deployed into the vicinity of Ingham township where it conducted security and protection operations during the initial phases of Exercise TALISMAN SABRE 23. During the final phase of the exercise, a combat team from the Battle Group deployed into the Townsville Field Training Area joining Battle Group HEELER (based on 6 RAR) to support the 1st (Australian) Division seizure of key crossing points to enable the Division to advance on its final objectives. 7 Battery deployed the full suite of its capabilities to support Battle Group WARATAH including a Joint Fires Team (JFT), Joint Fires and Effects Coordination Centre (JFECC), Joint ISR Support Team (JIST) and a Lightweight Multi-Mode Radar (LMMR).

As with every year there have been some changes to key appointments in 2023. Major Jonathan Passlow remained in command of 7 Battery while Warrant Officer Class 2 Stephen Potter continued to serve as the Battery Sergeant-Major, in conjunction with Captain Andrew Wallin as the Battery Captain. 7 Battery was joined by a number of new Officers in 2023. CAPT Isabel King posted in from SUR while LT Calvin Zeng, LT Daniel Abrams and LT Sam Tsaousis all joined the Battery upon commissioning into the RAA. I would also like to highlight LT Hugh Lightbody's promotion to CAPT and also BDRs Gavin Hughes, Adrian Orellana and Jack Snowden who were all promoted to the rank of SGT at the end of 2022.

7 Battery has been fortunate to have LT Mitchell Axon as its Instructor-Gunnery (IG) in 2023. LT Axon leaves the Battery at the end of year returning to 8/12 Regiment to take up a Joint Fires Officer role. Also only after one year, Warrant Officer Class 2 Michael Dunn, will leave the role of Sergeant-Major Instructor-Gunnery (SMIG) to take up a new posting at the School of Artillery. I would like to thank them both for their hard work and enthusiasm, and I wish them all the very best for their next postings.

Finally, on behalf of the soldiers and officers of 7 Battery, I would like to acknowledge the support of the 7 Field Regiment RAA Association to the Battery and thank the committee members for their ongoing work and support.

CONSECRATION OF QUEEN'S BANNER VICTORIA BARRACKS 5 NOV 2022

Representatives from all RAA Units assembled at Victoria Barracks for the Consecration of the new Queen's Banner on 5 November 2022, marking a belated 150th anniversary of the Regiment, postponed due to COVID-19 restrictions.

They were joined by the Governor-General GEN (retd) David Hurley and Chief of the Army LT GEN Simon Stuart.

It took 5 Embroiderers 7 months to hand stich the new RAA Queen's Banner, made entirely of silk, including 2% gold thread.

The Banner features the Royal Regiment of Australian Artillery emblem against a royal blue background – a colour reserved for Australian Army Regiments granted the Royal prefix.

The reverse side features St Edward's Crown above the letters E & R, with a roman numeral 11 between, denoting Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth 11's royal cypher.
